Castle and Gardens Update

By the time this issue of the Malahide Guardian appears it is hoped that Malahide Castle and Gardens will have opened. There have been several deferrals of the opening, partly due to the unexpected complexity of the work on such a sensitive building as the castle and delays caused by the weather.

Anyone who has been near the castle and gardens recently will have noticed the amount of construction activity going on and these external works were due to have been completed by 2 October. However the internal works at the castle and the resurfacing works at the west lawn will not be completed for a further two weeks and the opening date is now scheduled for Monday 15 October.

Fingal County Council and Shannon Heritage have high standards at the venues that they operate in Fingal and around the country. To ensure that this high quality standard is maintained at Malahide the decision was made to allow extra time to bring the venue up to a standard which will ensure satisfaction to the many visitors that are anticipated.

The AVOCA store, food hall and cafe area, which is being managed under a separate contract, was not affected by the remaining works and was due to open on 4 October.

Gold Again!

Malahide improved its performance yet again this year in the national Tidy Towns competition. We came second in the Dublin region after Skerries, which triumphed once more. However Malahide won a gold medal again – one of only two towns in the Dublin region to do so.

The judges pointed out some areas that need attention. Among these are wildlife and natural amenities, litter control and waste minimisation.

The residential areas gained a further point over last year and a special mention was made of the excellent improvements in Inbhir Ide.

Inbhir Ide also won a prize this year in the Fingal Cleaner Communities award, as did Seabury and The Moorings. Malahide earned a biodiversity award for the Bee Garden in front of the Library.

Great efforts were made for the competition and thanks are due to all who worked on their area and turned out for the various clean-ups. The Tidy Towns committee would appreciate if any residents' groups could send photographs of their efforts to
