

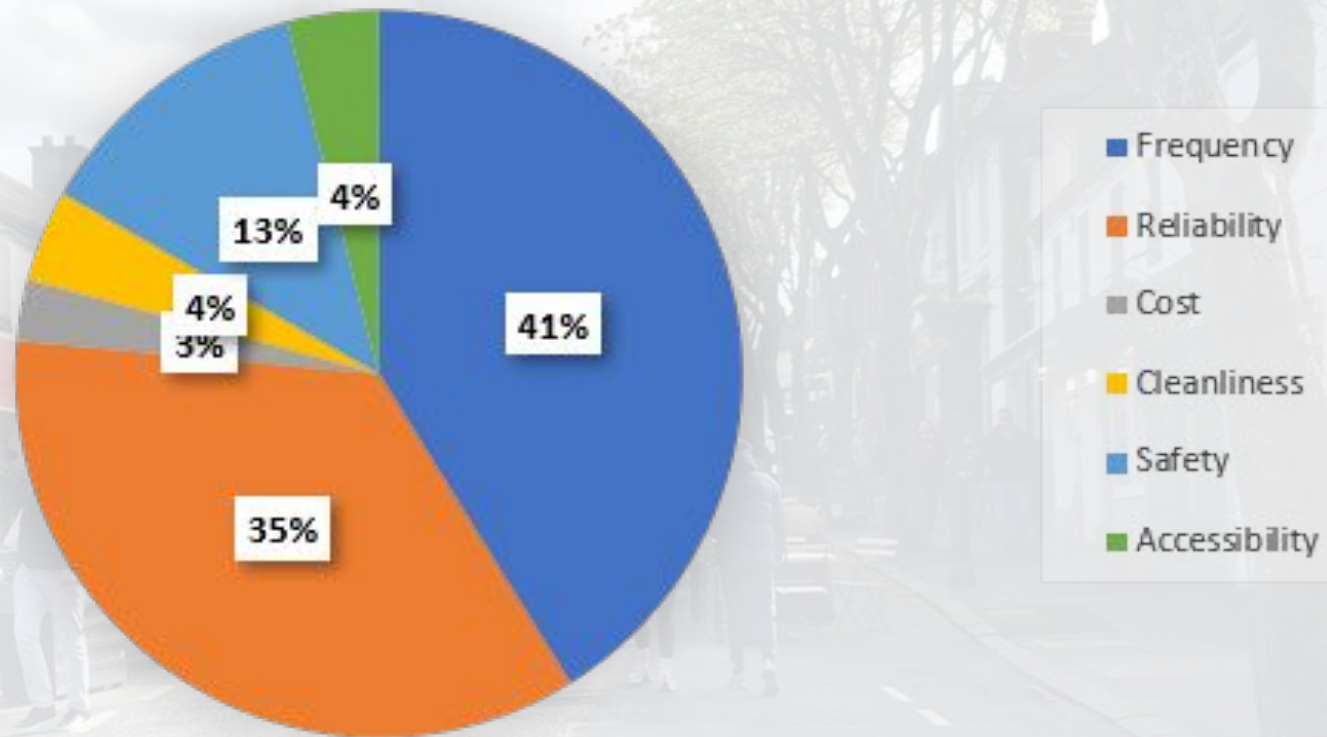
Resident Survey

Before the last General Election I launched transport surveys across all of Fingal.

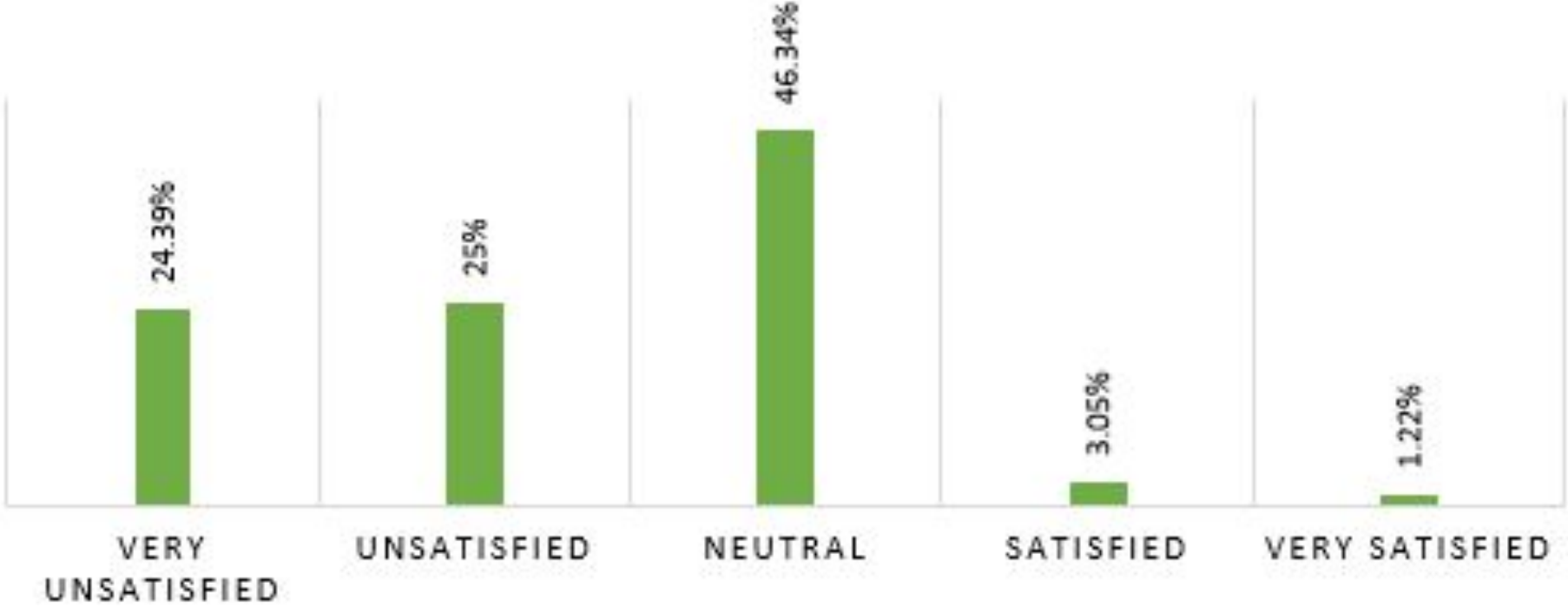
In Malahide 165 residents took part.

The results show widespread frustration with public transport and cycling

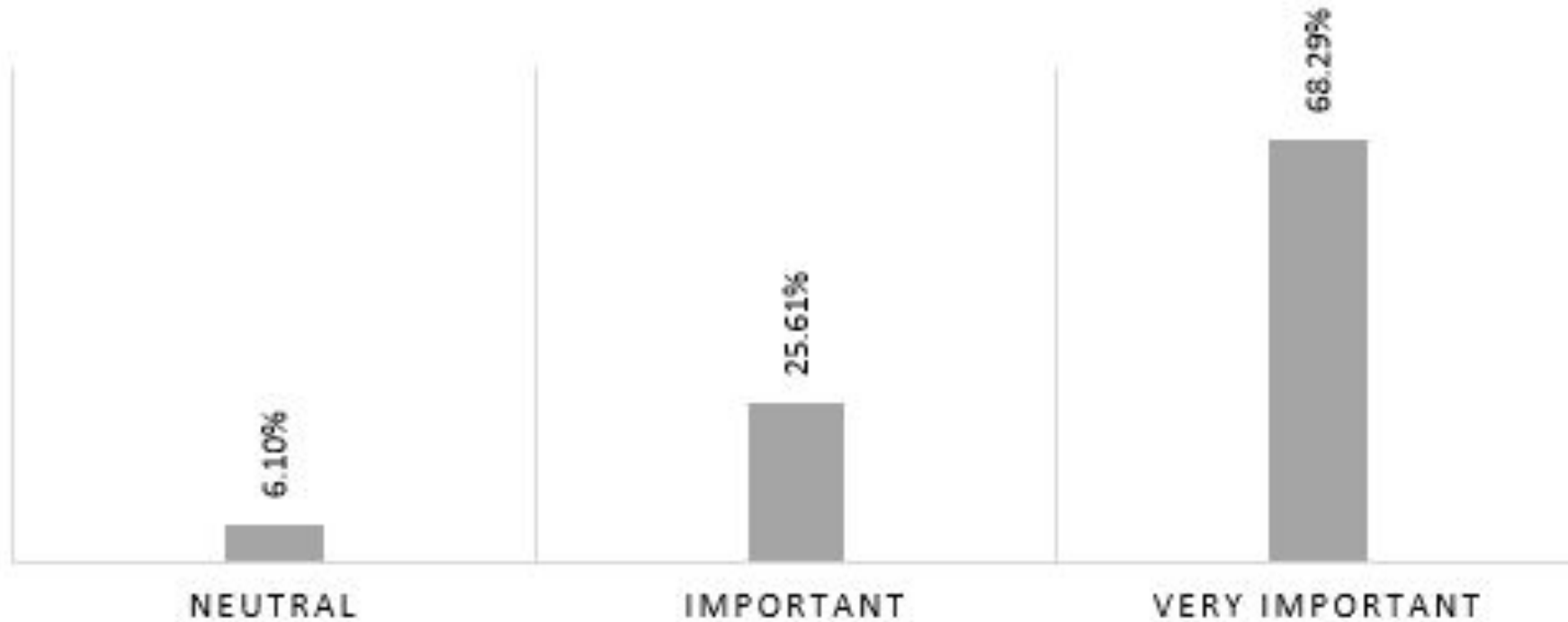
What are the main issues you face with the current transport options in Malahide

MALAHIDE?



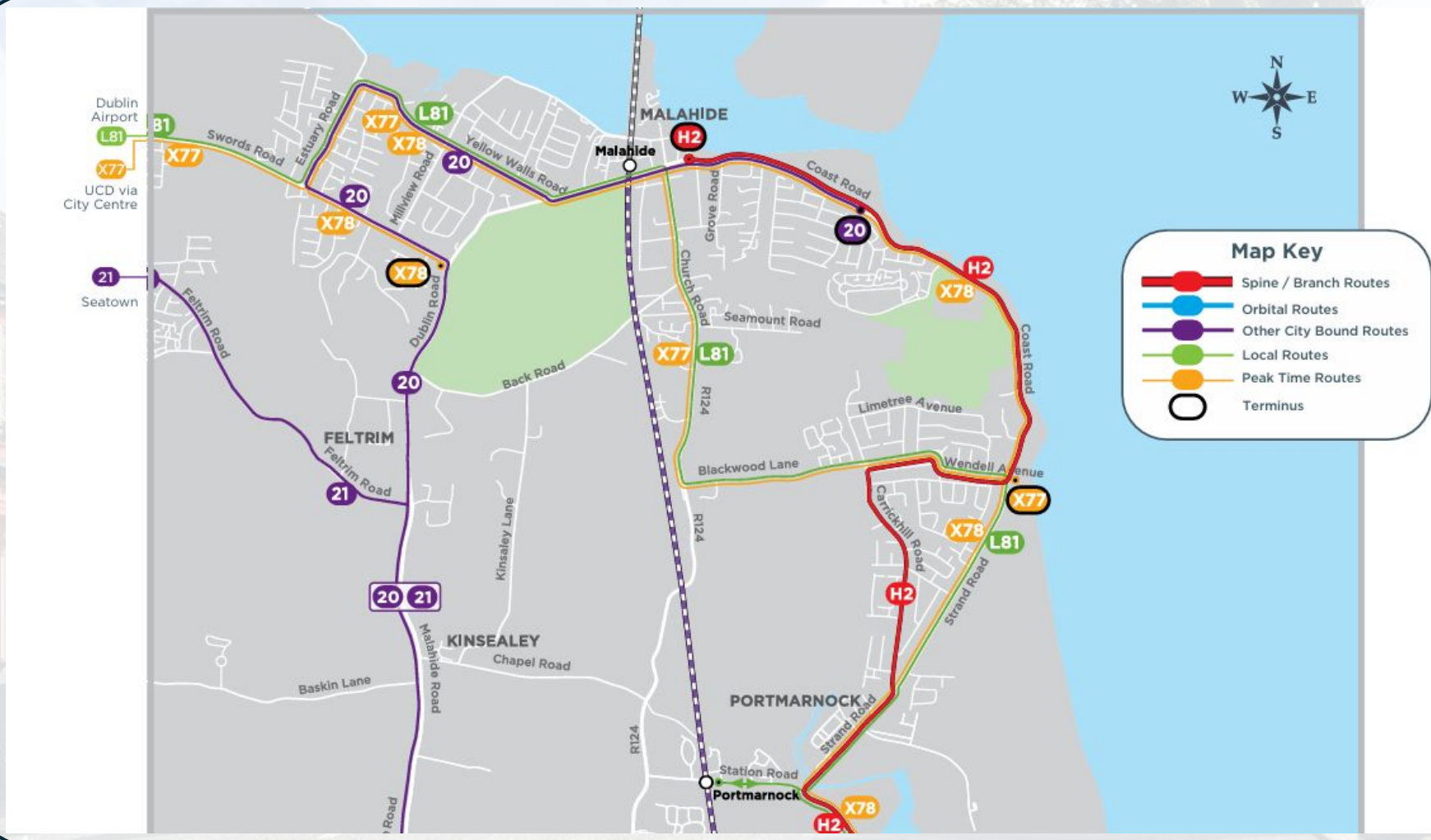


BUS CONN ECTS

Bus Connects has not been fully rolled out yet.

Residents of Malahide are still awaiting a number of routes to be rolled out like the X78 and the 20 routes

However new developments in Malahide will not be sufficiently serviced by Bus Connects.





Rail Servi ces

Tomorrow morning I am meeting with Irish Rail about the Northern Commuter Line and my campaign for a four-track solution.

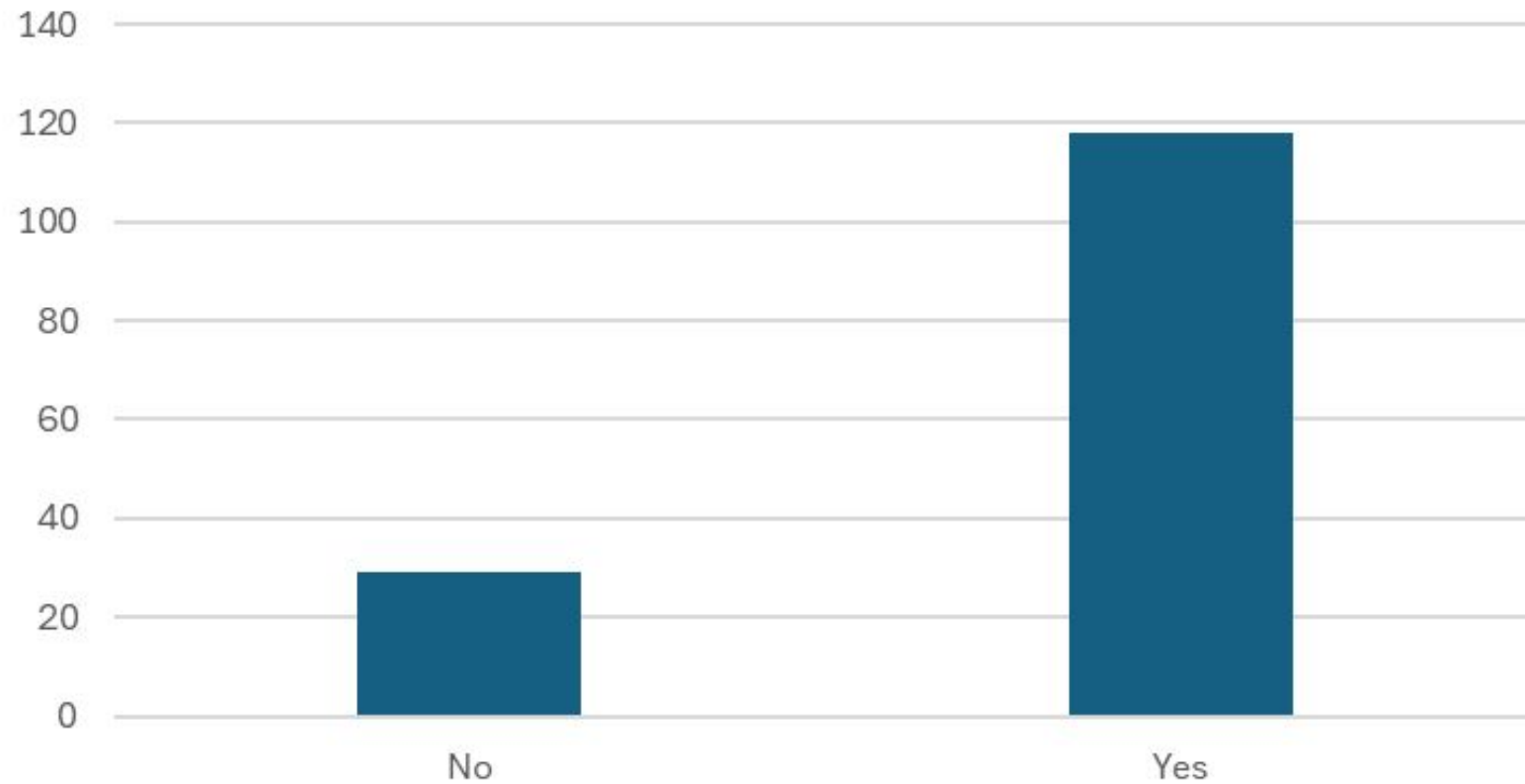


BARRACK BRIDGE
